The meeting will be held at Montgomery College, Paul Peck Art Building, room 403, at 2 p.m, on Saturday, November 10.

All participants should bring their own roll of masking tape (any width is fine) and their own x-acto knife with new number eleven blades. These can be found at any art store and also the college bookstore. We will be working with oil-based ink so it's a good idea to wear old clothes. Mr. Carr received a B.F.A. from Shepard University, printmaking major and an M.F.A. from West Virginia University. He taught printmaking at Shepard University for 10 years.

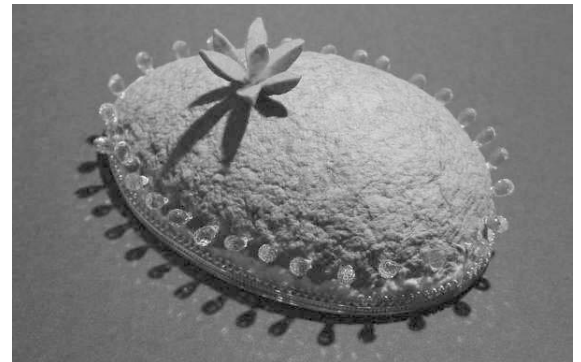

**Mary Ellen Gordon** has five paintings at The Gallery at Liriodendron with the Maryland Art League. The exhibit runs to October 14th.

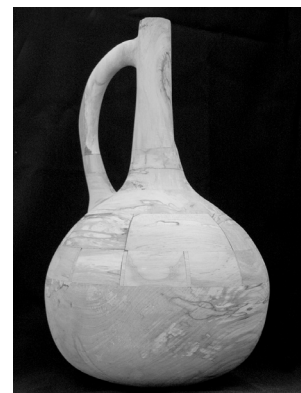
**Florence Gang** had paintings in a juried show of American University alumni at the Katzen Gallery in September and October.

**Mary Lou Shields** is showing watercolor paintings at the Kentlands Mansion, November 23 to January 13, and in the Potomac Valley Watercolorists show at St. Andrews Church, Arlington, VA, on October 27 and 28. She also had work in the Unitarian Church, Rockville, in September.

**Marianne Giguère** exhibited work in several shows and galleries in Maine during the summer, and sold four pieces.

**Stuart Glickman** won ribbons for four pieces at the Montgomery County fair. He received a first place ribbon, a champion rosette woodcraft ribbon and the adult grand champion crafts ribbon for a 14" turned and sculpted handled hollow wood vessel inspired by second-century Roman pottery (shown above). The other ribbons were a first, second and fourth in photography.

**Murray Stein** also showed at the fair and won an award for his wood turned bowl. Shown here is his wood turned sculpture titled "Keyboard Wizardry." The piece is an award winner in Texas. It started out as two bottomless bowls, which he cut apart (270 + 90 degrees) and glued back together in a different configuration. The base is a mahogany grand piano. Dimensions: 24" x 16' x 9". The keyboard is 48 segments of birch, and the black keys are ebony.

Bertha Padams is originally from Connecticut where she turned to a career in occupational health. After her marriage, her attentions were focused on raising her two children and pursuing painting and drawing as a hobby.

Summers were spent at resorts where her husband, Jim (a culinary arts instructor at the Culinary Institute of America), took crews of students to intern at private clubs in New York and New England. Bertha utilized her artistic talents in working with the students preparing culinary art for the formal buffets. Her work included sculptures of tallow, puff paste and butter and carved vegetable pieces.

In 1995, doors to a new world opened when they moved to Maryland, and Bertha enrolled in art classes at Montgomery College where she continues to enjoy developing her skills in watercolor, pastel and sculpture. Bertha belongs to the Senior Artists Alliance, the Olney Art Association, Rockville Art League, the Strathmore Artists and Maryland Pastel Society. She has won several awards in watercolor and pastels.

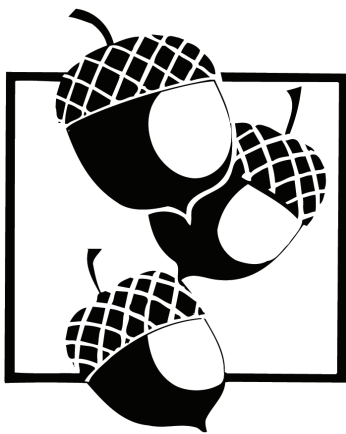
